

Why this website?

We have currently two scandalous situations going on in Europe. In the southern countries, such as Greece, Italy, Spain, and Portugal, many people are unemployed, including medical doctors. In Germany, in contrast, we have a deficit of doctors. This is a very current topic. An article in a Spanish newspaper ([Granadahoy, 27 May, 2013](#)) says that 6 out of 166 residents will have contracts after finishing their exams. In other words, they only have the choices of being unemployed, working as a freelancer only a few days as a substitute, starting a new speciality training, or [emigrating](#). This is a scandalous situation after 11 or 12 years training (including studies). On the other hand, a German publication ([22 May, 2013](#)) shows that we have a deficit of nearly 20,000 medical doctors in Germany. This is also an extremely scandalous situation. In the public health system, the deficit reaches 12,000 medical doctors in the hospitals, and between 6,000 to 8,000 professionals in their practices. According [to estimates](#), this figure will rise to 37,000 by 2019.
